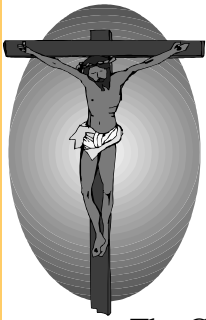

7. No children's shot stayed on the green at #2

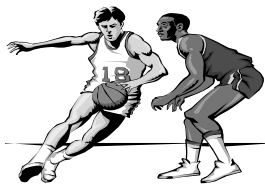

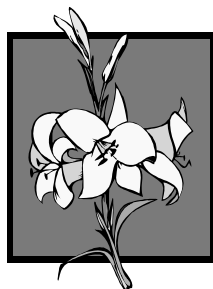

Maura Welch Wins Impressive Award

CBA student, Maura Welch was honored on March 11, 2002 for her leadership at the state and national levels on issues of concern for the diocese and Catholic Charities.



For the past two and a half years, Maura Welch, a Parishioner at St. Vincent de Paul Parish in Syracuse, has worked tirelessly for the less fortunate. As a member of the New York State Labor and Religion Coalition, Maura traveled to Mexico with her father Paul Welch, an associate director of Catholic Charities for Onondaga County, to see the abject poverty and horrible conditions up front.

Maura's award, the New York State Council of Catholic Charities' Directors DeFazio Award, named for Vincenza De Fazio, an attorney for the Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of New York, who was hit by a bus and killed in 1992, is a great accomplishment. Way to go Maura !
