## From the Principal...

Dear CBA Community,

Currently, there are six Christian Brothers' provinces in the United States. Because of the diminishing numbers of religious, the three provinces in the east are preparing to join together within a year. The resulting province will include educational and child care institutions in Maryland, New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Rhode Island, and Michigan along with the District of Columbia and the Province of Ontario. Representatives met in April to examine existing ministries and vision future possibilities for association and collaboration as we strive to guarantee the continuation of our Lasallian heritage and charism. In the summer, the Brothers impacted will assemble for a planning retreat at La Salle University in Philadelphia.

After registration in March, I was pleased to write a letter of welcome to our incoming seventh and ninth graders. At a time when some Catholic schools in the various parts of the United States are experiencing declines in enrollment, we are fortunate that interest in CBA remains favorable. As a Lasallian Catholic school, CBA strives to provide an environment that will develop young people who will be productive members of society and the future leaders of our community. Please know that all your efforts to support and encourage our educational mission are appreciated.

CBA was pleased to host a group of Russian educators as part of the International Visitor Leadership Program sponsored by the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs. During their two hour visit and tour, the six visitors and their interpreters met with religion teachers, administrators, and guidance and campus ministry staff. Their primary areas of interest were integrating values into the curriculum, drug prevention activities, and civic education.

As part of the recent Honors Night program, two dozen special awards were presented. Among the recipients was Melissa Zajdel who received the *Cornell University Book Award*. Congratulations Melissa! Selections are made on the basis of academic excellence, outstanding character, and demonstrated leadership. CBA students have been among the recipients of this highly prestigious recognition for 12 of the past 18 years.

Brenda Sharman, National Director of Pure Fashion, took time from her busy schedule to speak to the junior high girls in March. ### MATH-MANIA!

Several CBA 7th grade students recently participated in the Math-A-Thon to benefit St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital. Over \$850 was raised by students this year. In the last 5 years, CBA students have raised more than \$9,000 to benefit the patients at St. Jude's by participating in the Math-A-Thon.

### NEWTON'S LAWS ON ICE

On April 11, seventh graders took a field trip to Syracuse University's Tenny Ice Rink to continue their semester long study of physics. The skaters participated in velocity and acceleration "time trials", skating straight-line and lap distances. All students had an active role in the collection of the data as skater, time-keeper or data recorder. Back at school, the information was used to calculate a skater's velocity, acceleration, momentum and force. ## **STUDENT AFFAIRS**

### **STUDENT DRIVING AND PARKING**

Students and Parents are reminded that for a student to drive and park on school property they first must obtain a parking permit. Application forms are available in the main office and there is a \$10 fee to obtain a permit.

Since there is limited student parking available, when the main student lot is full students will then have to park in the "upper lot" beyond the stadium. As there are a number of students who obtain their driver's license around this time of year, we anticipate that the main student lot will become full each day necessitating late arriving students using the "upper lot". Arriving late to school due to having to park in the "upper lot" is not an excused late to school. Students need to plan on leaving home early enough each day so that they will be in their homeroom prior to the late bell regardless of which lot they park in.

### **STUDENTS BEING EXCUSED FROM SCHOOL DURING THE DAY**

In order for a student to be excused, a written note from the parent must be presented to the nurse by the student prior to the start of the school day. The note must list the specific reason for requesting the student be allowed to leave school prior to the end of the school day. Emails and/or phone requests for a student be excused are not acceptable. School administration may or may not grant the request based on the specific reason stated. Notes that say "please excuse \_\_\_\_\_" without a specific reason being given will not be honored.

We request that parents resist requests from their children to write an excuse for them to get out of school early, or arrive late, for frivolous reasons. Students sometimes ask their parents to exaggerate or not be truthful in writing an attendance note for school. What is the message that you are sending to your child, and the school administration, if you give in to such a request?

### **PLEASE BE CONSIDERATE**

When picking up your child at the end of the school day. Do not block traffic either in our parking lot or attempting to enter our parking lot from Randall Road. Thank you for your cooperation!
